Statement of Purpose

The St. Mary's County Museum Division of the Department of Recreation, Parks and Community Services was instituted by the St. Mary's County Board of Commissioners to collect, preserve, research and interpret the historic sites and artifacts that illustrate the natural and cultural histories of St. Clement's Island and the Potomac River, the Piney Point Lighthouse and the Chesapeake Bay, and the African American and Charlotte Hall schoolhouses.

With this as its charter, the Museum Division serves as a resource, liaison and community advocate for all St. Mary's County public and private cultural assets.

T*his annual report* represents the combined efforts of all of the Museum Division staff and expresses our deep appreciation to the many individuals and groups in our community who support our work. Here we document our physical assets and highlight our 2007 programs, and pay tribute to the individuals, businesses and community partners who helped us to achieve those goals. We've done our best to identify each and every one of you; please let us know if there are any omissions and forgive us for them.

We hope you'll take pride and feel ownership in this institution and its programs, exhibits, and preservation projects. We'll maintain a tradition of regularly reporting back to you about the return on your investment in the St. Mary's County Museum Division.

We would also like to offer special thanks to the Friends of the St. Clement's Island and Piney Point Museums for providing the funding to produce the first annual report of the St. Mary's County Museum Division.

Overview of Facilities

The St. Mary's County Museum Division, on behalf of St. Mary's County government, manages 94 acres of property and 4 historic sites, including: St. Clement's Island Museum and the Charlotte Hall Schoolhouse; the Piney Point Lighthouse, Museum and Historic Park; the Drayden African American Schoolhouse; and the U-1105 Underwater Submarine Shipwreck Preserve near Piney Point Park. The Museum Division assists with the monitoring and maintenance of St. Clement's Island State Park. Also in the Museum Division's care are:

- 6 historic buildings including the Piney Point Lighthouse; Piney Point Lighthouse Keeper's Quarters; the Piney Point Lighthouse Fuel Building; the 1943 U.S. Navy Workshop Building; the Drayden African American Schoolhouse; and the Charlotte Hall Schoolhouse
- 6 contemporary support buildings, 4 public piers, an outreach van and 1 water taxi.
- 4525 artifacts, 729 photographs, 364 documents, 522 library volumes catalogued, 162 artifacts on loan to the Museum Division and 23 artifacts on loan to other institutions. 100 artifacts remain to be catalogued.

Restoration/Preservation Work Completed in 2007

Work started in June 07 on the restoration of the Potomac River Dory Boat "Doris C" at the SCIM.

Work continues on removing paint from the Piney Point Lighthouse tower to prepare for stripping the exterior and interior paint to be replaced with the original lime white wash. Because of the high moisture environment, consultants agree the white wash will allow the structure to breathe, stabilizing the brick for the next century.

Minor roof, chimney and door repairs made to the Drayden African American Schoolhouse.

Minor painting and some structural repairs made to the Charlotte Hall Schoolhouse (Little Red Schoolhouse) at the St. Clement's Island Museum

Assessment was conducted to replace the roof on the Piney Point Keeper's Quarters for an FY 09 project.

Capital Improvements and Grant Projects Completed

Replaced all signage and implemented a newly-designated parking area for Drayden African American Schoolhouse with grants and in-kind assistance from the Southern Maryland Heritage Area Consortium and the United Committee for Afro-American Contributions.

Completed phase one signage fabrication and installation for St. Clement's Island and an Interpretive Master Plan for the Piney Point Lighthouse, Museum and Historic Park; interpretive signage and designs for the Potomac River Maritime Exhibit Building with grants from the Chesapeake Bay Gateway Network; the Chesapeake Bay Running Club, and the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority.

Initiated work on Piney Point parking, walkway and landscape work and Potomac River Maritime Exhibit Building exhibit fabrication and installation with grants from the Maryland Heritage Area Authority.

Nearly completed work on the U-1105 German Submarine permanent exhibit at Piney Point.

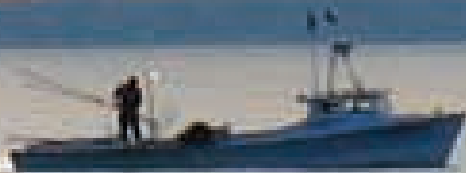
