FY 2005 Youth Sports Participation and Facility Use

SUMMARY

Youth sports participation and facility use statistics are vital when addressing needs for park land acquisition, development, and facility usage. This information is necessary for both short and long term requirements. Included in the **FY 2005 Youth Sports Participation and Facility Use Report** are participation and facility use statistics for Recreation, Parks and Community Services sponsored and volunteer youth sports leagues. Facility use needs and recommendations provided by Recreation, Parks and Community Services staff are also included in the report.

The Department sponsors a youth basketball league, which operates in various public schools, as well as indoor soccer, roller hockey, field hockey, and lacrosse leagues at the Leonard Hall Recreation Center. These programs are funded through fees and charges and operate from the Departments' Activity Fund Budget.

The Department is also affiliated with twelve (12) Youth Sports Leagues. Listed below are the leagues and the general areas of the county they operate in.

The Department assists the leagues by providing safe playing fields, game and practice scheduling and coaches training and certification.

NATIONAL LITTLE LEAGUE

7 of 17 60' fields are fully utilized with three or more teams.
 1 out of 3 90' fields are fully utilized.
 1 field on NAS Pax used as home field for three teams. Included in list of 17.
 League uses Ridge Elem., Piney Point, Little Flower, Park Hall, Jarboesville,
 Carver and Cardinal Gibbons as practice fields only.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Two additional 60' fields in the Hollywood area are needed due to losing the fields at Old Hollywood school, St. Johns and one field at new Hollywood.
- 2) National Little League turned over the 90ft. field at Jarboesville Park to American Little League.
- 3) Consider assigning Leonardtown Middle field to American Little League.
- 4) Pursue possibility of an additional private field being constructed at Wildewood.
- 5) Consider expanding the parking lot at Laurel Ridge.

CHALLENGES/ISSUES

- 1) National Little League has lost the use of the 60' field at Lexington Park Elem due to a new playground.
- 2) Discontinue the use of the 60' field at Old Hollywood School due to conflicts with other programs.
- 3) American Little League will temporarily be losing the use of the back field at Hollywood Elementary due to relocatables being placed there.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Practice areas not being used by soccer will be assigned to girls lacrosse.

Facility needs appear to be marginally satisfied at this time, anticipate additional space.

CHALLENGES/ISSUES

1. The addition of girls lacrosse leagues has created field space issues.

2. Previously, Myrtle Point Park was discussed as a possible site for Girl's lacrosse fields. However, the BOCC recently adopted a master plan for Myrtle Point as a nature park so athletic fields will not be included at this facility. RP&CS is working with the league and a private land owner in Medley's Neck regarding possible fields.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Need additional practice areas in concentrated areas such as Charlotte Hall, California and Hollywood.
- 2) Refurbish practice areas and fields at 5th District Park/Lettie Dent School.

CHALLENGES/ISSUES

- 1) Recreation, Parks and Community Services will do a master plan for the 43 acre Northern Senior Center site in Charlotte Hall and consider multipurpose fields for that site.
- 2) Improved communication between leagues and Recreation, Parks and Community Services on program expansion (i.e. travel teams) and facility needs.
- 3) Continued coordination needed between the leagues and Recreation, Parks and Community Services on scheduling practices.
