FY 2006 Youth Sports Participation and Facility Use

SUMMARY

Youth sports participation and facility use statistics are vital when addressing needs for park land acquisition, development, and facility usage. This information is necessary for both short and long term requirements. Included in the **FY 2006 Youth Sports Participation and Facility Use Report** are participation and facility use statistics for Recreation, Parks and Community Services sponsored and volunteer youth sports leagues. Facility use needs and recommendations provided by Recreation, Parks and Community Services staff are also included in the report.

The Department sponsors a youth basketball league, which operates in various public schools, as well as indoor soccer, roller hockey, field hockey, and lacrosse leagues at the Leonard Hall Recreation Center. These programs are funded through fees and charges and operate from the Departments' Activity Fund Budget.

The Department is also affiliated with twelve (12) Youth Sports Leagues. Listed below are the leagues and the general areas of the county they operate in.

The leagues are responsible for all financial operations and administer their funds through league bank accounts. The Department assists the leagues by providing safe playing fields, game and practice scheduling and coaches training and certification.

 League uses Ridge Elem., Piney Point, Little Flower, Park Hall, Jarboesville,
 Carver and Cardinal Gibbons as practice fields only.

CHALLENGES/ISSUES/CONSIDERATIONS

- 1) Difficulty using the Leonardtown middle field due to high school lacrosse practice.
- 2) Losing the use of the Leonardtown elementary school fields due to school construction.
- 3) Alternative uses for the 90 ft field at 5th District Park due to lack of use.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Two additional 60' fields are needed in the Hollywood area due to the loss of fields at Leonardtown Elementary School.
- 2) National Little league needs to turn over the 90ft field at Jarboesville Park to the American League or other leagues.
- 3) Pursue the possibility of an additional private field being constructed at Wildewood.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2) Better definition of practice spaces at Dorsey Park.
- 3) Possible addition of fields on the convience center property in Charlotte Hall.
- 4) Better utilize the practice areas at Chaptico Park.

CHALLENGES/ISSUES

- 1) Create a rotation of fields so they can be maintained properly.
- 2) Improved communication between leagues and Recreation, Parks and Community Services on program expansion (i.e. travel teams) and facility needs.
- 3) Continued coordination needed between the leagues and Recreation, Parks and Community Services on scheduling practices.
