Message from the Director – Technology Cul-De-Sac

The 2010 Technology Handbooks for St. Mary's County are now available. A total of 221 technology firms are listed. This represents a net increase of 6 companies, or about 3%, over last year. There are actually more than 20 new firms listed, but the total also includes those that closed, moved, or chose not to be listed. Growth of any amount this past year is good news. In perspective, there were 129 firms listed in 2000. An increase of almost 100 firms in the past decade is very good news. We'll be delivering the new tech books over the coming weeks. Please contact our office or stop by to get a copy.

As any user knows, our Tech Book contains an incredible amount of information about each company and the industry as a whole. It is THE business directory for our technology sector. Additionally, the Tech Book also lists more than 50 support organizations from the chief customer, NAS Patuxent River, to business development resources, to education and training institutions, to professional organizations and associations. Also listed are the 26 wireless internet locations in the County. And for the first time, there are 12 lodging locations listed that offer per diem rates.

One statistic we're very proud of is that 75 technology firms, fully one-third of all listed, are home-grown businesses founded right here in St. Mary's County. This is a very inviting business climate for start-up

firms. The growing presence of local firms helps reinforce the uniqueness of our community and the quality of life we all enjoy.

I had a light-hearted conversation recently about a Technology Corridor sign along a rural stretch of road in Great Mills. It seems a little out of place. Then we thought more about it. I remembered what a start-up business owner suggested as a more accurate description of our county: Technology Cul-De-Sac. We laughed, then realized it wasn't far from the mark. We're not the 270 Corridor. We're St. Mary's, a peninsula, the only county in the state you can't drive through. We are a destination, thus a Technology Destination. Maybe that's a more accurate sign title. A quick look at the map on the inside cover of the Tech Book really shows this.

Whatever label is used, our technology industry is alive, well, growing, and very unique. The cover of the 2010 Technology Handbook blends a printed circuit board into our distinct geography. Thanks to local artist and technology employee Edward Holton, Jr. a graphic artist at ManTech Systems Engineering and Advanced Technology Group, for this clever design. And thanks to all involved in our technology enterprise. We can look forward to the 2020 Tech Book with much hope and promise.

Occurring twice annually, "Savor St. Mary's" will feature a seasonal line-up of items locally grown and produced as presented through the creative interpretation of area restaurants. Kicking off this summer: **July 25-August 8, 2010**, "Savor St. Mary's" will highlight fresh seasonal produce. The 2011 event will be February 15-28 and will have an emphasis on local seafood and wine.
